FOR MORE INFORMATION CONTACT:
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WHO CAN VOTE IN WESTCHESTER COUNTY?

To be eligible to vote in Westchester County:

- Be a U.S. Citizen
- Be 18 years of age by the date of the general, primary or other election in which you want to vote
- Live at your present address at least 30 days before an election
- Not be in prison for a felony conviction
- Not claim the right to vote elsewhere





IMPORTANT ELECTION INFORMATION

Primary Election

- An election to choose the candidates that will represent their political party in the general election.
- This year in Westchester County, the **Primary Election** will be held on Tuesday, June 28, 2022.

General Election

- An election to choose the candidates that will represent their political party in the general election.
- This year in Westchester County, the **General Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8, 2022.**
